HABÍA UNA VEZ... EN DINAMARCA



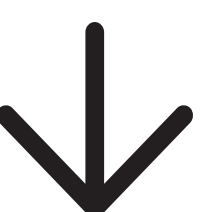


This is a space designed for girls and boys,

Hans Christian Andersen was born on April 2, 1805 in a Danish fishing village called Odense. His family was very poor and led a simple life. He was the son of a washerwoman and a shoemaker. As a child, he attended school only occasionally.

Hans was a curious and creative child, he loved theater and deeply loved acting. When he was 11 years old, his father died, so soon after he started working in different trades and never stopped reading and imagining other possible worlds. He created his own universe and shared it with everyone.

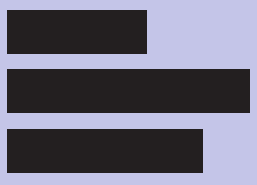
The Steadfast Tin Soldier [*Den stanbdhaftige Tinsoldat*], 1848

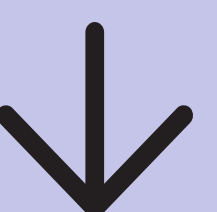

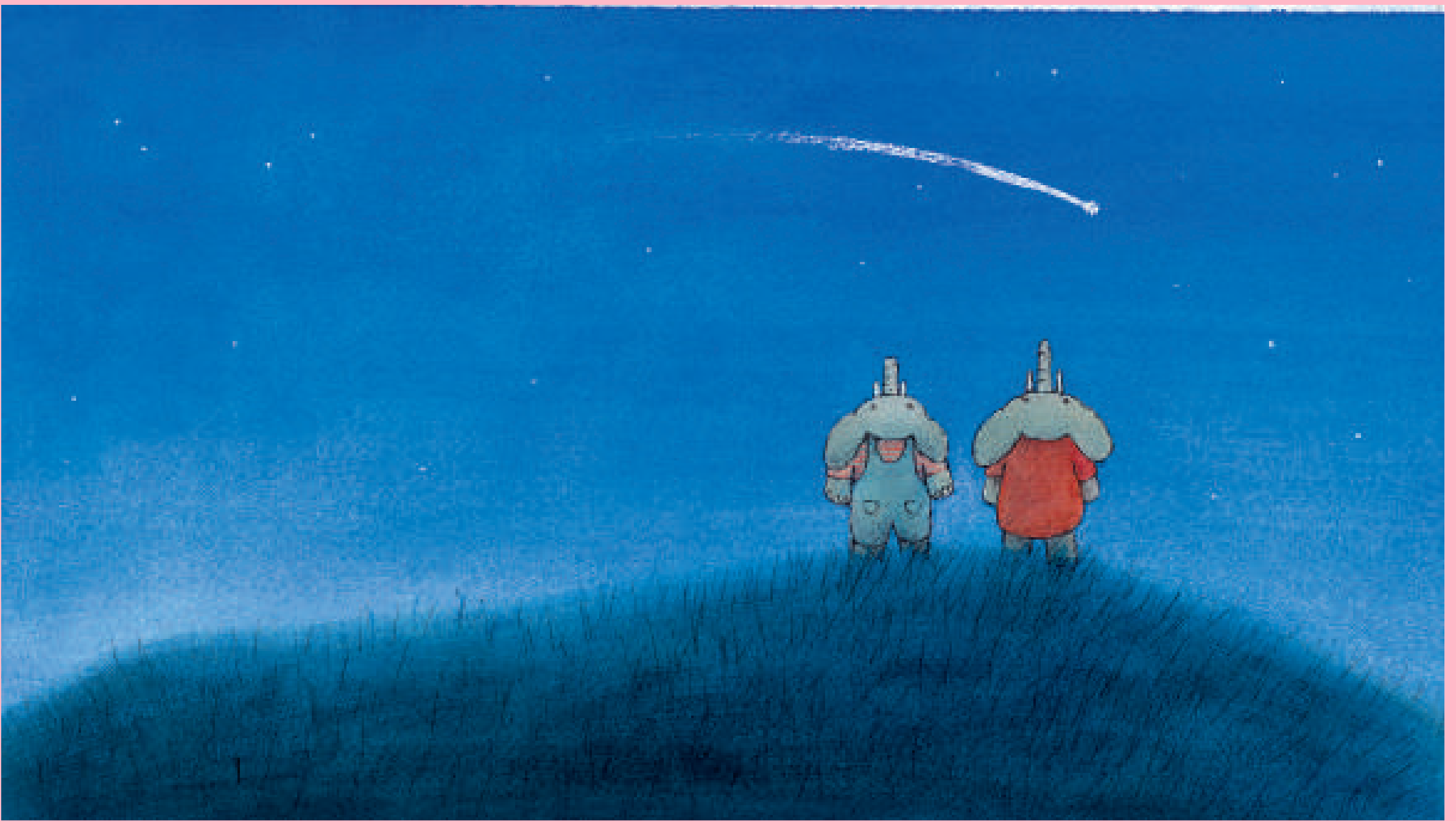

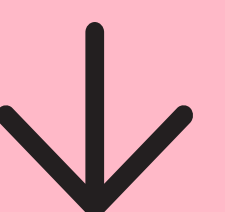
